The Civil Air Patrol continued to assist in the search for Tara today.

Command One has projected that it will take an additional 7 to 10 days to complete an absolute search of Irwin County.

There were 60 people in attendance for today's search. We were pleased to accept help from both local volunteers and staff and those from surrounding areas. We have a number of people who have come in from out of town to assist in the search. Efforts are being made to provide acceptable housing for volunteers who have been kind enough to donate their time for the quest to find Tara.

A number of businesses have been kind enough to assist us in feeding the search crews which at times are upwards of 200 individuals. We continue to seek support in providing food and drinks for search crews.

A Candlelight Vigil will be held in Ocilla at the Courthouse on Friday 11/4 beginning at 7pm. The vigil is hosted by current and former students of Miss Grinstead.

The reward has been raised to \$80,000 after a sizable donation from Liberty National.
